Pan Am to start daily Orlando Sanford - New York flights
Airline also begins Orlando Sanford - Miami flights

Sanford, FL., May 31, 2002 - Orlando Sanford International Airport (SFB) announced today that Pan Am will begin daily non-stop service between Orlando Sanford and New York's Newark International Airport (EWR) on June 28th.

Flights depart Orlando Sanford at 11:30 a.m. and arrive Newark at 2:00 p.m. Return service departs Newark at 2:45 p.m. and arrives Orlando Sanford at 5:25 p.m. Pan Am will operate 149-seat Boeing 727-200 aircraft on the route. Both leisure and business travelers will enjoy the additional legroom in Pan Am's all-coach Clipper class offering the most leg room in coach between Orlando and New York.

Dave Fink, President of Pan Am, commented on the new service, "We are very excited to offer the first non-stop from Orlando Sanford to New York. As Central Florida's number one visitor market, we have high expectations for this "new" New York service. This service will provide a convenient alternative for visitors to come and enjoy Central Florida's attractions and beaches and also make it easier for Central Floridians to get to New York for business or pleasure."

In addition, Pan Am has begun twice weekly service between Orlando Sanford and Miami using its 727 jets. Flights operate Thursday and Sunday and will compliment the airline's growing intra-Florida service, which includes Naples and St. Petersburg-Clearwater.

For the second year in a row, the Airports Council International (ACI) ranked SFB as the fastest growing North American airport in 2001, among airports with one million or more annual passengers. Orlando Sanford International Airport is located near the Orlando attractions and is also convenient to Daytona Beach. Adjacent to the airport are the business communities of Lake Mary and Heathrow, part of Florida's "High Tech Corridor." Airlines and their passengers enjoy convenient parking, new terminal facilities, short walking distances, and low operating costs.
